More good news at ACHS

The ACHS and the Shelter Medicine Program at the University of Missouri have been partners since March 2017. Our small shelter in Kirksville has benefitted greatly from this partnership.



Many animals have been able to be spayed/neutered through this program prior to going to their forever homes. The staff, board, and volunteers at ACHS have learned a great deal together.

When the big yellow and black surgery van pulls into the parking area at the shelter there are smiles all around. This has been a win for the veterinarian students, win for the animals, and a win for the shelter overall. Not enough can be said for the great relationship that has developed between Shelter Manager Missy Decker and the doctors from Mizzou: Dr. Amie Burling and Dr. Leon Tu.

When we decided to build the new Cat Camp, we had a dream that the room vacated by the cats could be put to a good use. We dreamed about a surgical room where the shelter pets would receive all needed procedures before they were adopted.

We are happy to announce our dream is coming true. Dr. Amie Burling, at the Shelter Medicine Program at the University of Missouri has been instrumental in applying for and winning a grant for us to do that very thing. This grant has awarded us \$50,000 to be used for that purpose. No longer will we have to depend on the weather for the big surgical van to travel. This new room will ensure our animals are all fixed before they are adopted. This is a major step in taking care of the animals in our area. ACHS will need to contribute to have the room cleaned, painted, and have some remediation work completed as soon as possible. More good things are on the way at the shelter! Stay tuned for more details about the grant and surigical room.
